

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF LANSDALE, MONTGOMERY COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, APPROVING AN INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN LANSDALE BOROUGH AND THE NORTH PENN WATER AUTHORITY FOR BILLING SERVICES, AS REQUIRED BY THE PENNSYLVANIA INTERGOVERNMENTAL COOPERATION ACT; REPEALING ALL INCONSISTENT ORDINANCES OR PARTS THEREOF; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, Lansdale Borough (the "Borough") and the North Penn Water Authority ("NPWA") have entered into negotiations on an agreement under which NPWA would issue invoices to customers of the Borough's sewer service at the same time that NPWA bills its customers for public water service; and

WHEREAS, the Borough and NPWA have reached an agreement (the "Agreement") regarding NPWA issuing a joint bill for water and sewer service; and

WHEREAS, the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act, 53 Pa.C.S. §2301, *et seq.* requires all agreements between two or more municipal entities to be approved by ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the Borough desires to approve the Agreement and authorize it to be executed by the appropriate Borough officials;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it, and it is hereby **ORDAINED** by Lansdale Borough Council, and it is hereby **ENACTED** and **ORDAINED** by authority of same as follows:

- I. The attached Agreement between the Borough and NPWA is hereby approved.
- II. The President of Borough Council and the Borough Secretary are hereby authorized to execute the Agreement on behalf of the Borough.
- III. All ordinances or parts thereof inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of the inconsistency.
- IV. The provisions of this Ordinance are declared to be severable. If any provision of this Ordinance is declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional, such determination shall have no effect on the remaining provisions of this Ordinance.
- V. This Ordinance shall become effective five (5) days following its legal enactment.

AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is made this _____ day of _____, 2016, between **NORTH PENN WATER AUTHORITY** (“North Penn”) and **LANSDALE BOROUGH** (“Lansdale”).

RECITALS:

A. North Penn is a Pennsylvania municipal authority with a principal office located at 300 Forty Foot Road, Lansdale, Pennsylvania 19446 and is the entity designated for providing public water service, and the billing and collection for same, in Lansdale Borough.

B. Lansdale is a Pennsylvania borough with a principal office located at One Vine Street, Lansdale, PA 19446 and is the entity responsible for providing public sanitary sewer service, and the billing and collection for same, in Lansdale Borough.

C. Lansdale and North Penn, in an effort to reduce costs, provide economy of scales, and enhanced customer service to joint customers, engaged each other to have a single water and sewer bill and collection service by North Penn.

D. The Pennsylvania Intergovernmental Cooperation Law, 53 Pa. C.S.A. § 2301, et seq., authorizes municipalities and municipal authorities to enter into agreements with other like entities in order to cooperate in performing governmental powers, duties and functions and in carrying into effect provisions of law relating to said subjects which are common to such political subdivisions.

E. Lansdale and North Penn desire to set forth in writing their understandings relating to North Penn providing sewer billing and collection services for Lansdale.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and promises hereinafter set forth, and intending to be legally bound hereby, the parties agree as follows:

AGREEMENT

1. North Penn agrees to provide the sewer billing and collection services for Lansdale to those customers utilizing Lansdale's public sewer system as follows:

a). North Penn shall issue a joint water and sewer bill to Lansdale customers, provided Lansdale provides North Penn with the information necessary to generate the sewer bill five (5) days prior to the issuance of bills. The contents of such bill, and the issuance of same, shall be in accordance with North Penn's standard billing policies and schedules. Lansdale agrees to amend its applicable ordinances and/or resolutions to reflect the standard sewer billing and collection practices of North Penn provided that such proposed ordinances and/or resolutions are acceptable to the Lansdale Borough Solicitor and Lansdale Borough Council.

b). If the Lansdale customer utilizes a private well, Lansdale shall provide North Penn with the information necessary to generate a sewer bill five (5) days prior to issuance of bills. Lansdale shall provide North Penn with a list of those customers utilizing private wells.

c). Lansdale agrees to provide North Penn with at least thirty (30) days' notice of any increase in its sewer rates and charges.

d). All user charges, including sewer charges, shall be payable to North Penn Water Authority.

e). Within thirty (30) days of receipt of a sewer payment, North Penn shall remit such payment to Lansdale. No payments shall be required from North Penn on delinquent accounts until such time as North Penn is in receipt of such payment.

2. Lansdale agrees to pay North Penn \$.90 per bill issued to Lansdale sewer customers for 2016. North Penn shall invoice Lansdale monthly for the collection of such fee, and Lansdale agrees to remit payment to North Penn within thirty (30) days of receipt of such invoice. The parties agree that such rate will increase as outlined in Exhibit "A" attached hereto and incorporated herein for the initial term of this Agreement. Should the parties agree to an increase above what is provided for in Exhibit "A" for any given year, such increase shall be agreed to in writing between the parties. Should this Agreement extend past the initial term, the parties shall amend Exhibit "A", however should no amendment be made, the billing rate shall continue to be the rate of the prior year until such time as Exhibit "A" is revised to account for the extension.

3. North Penn shall file all notices and collect all delinquent fees in accordance with the Municipal Claims and Tax Liens Act, 53 P.S. 7101 et. seq. Any legal fees incurred by North Penn as a result of collection of both delinquent sewer and water accounts shall be divided equally between North Penn and Lansdale. Should North Penn initiate water shut off proceedings for delinquent accounts, North Penn agrees to comply with the Water Services Act of 2006 as well as all applicable laws and regulations. North Penn shall copy Lansdale on any shut off notice to a Lansdale customer. Such shut off notice shall provide at least ten (10) days' notice prior to the intended shut off date. Should Lansdale request that North Penn refrain from shutting off water service to a customer, North Penn shall adhere to this request for a time period as agreed to by the parties.

4. Partial payments received from a customer for water and sewer services will be allocated between water and sewer invoices based on the weighted share of each service included in the invoice calculation unless such payment clearly indicates which service is being paid for, this includes payment on delinquent accounts.

5. North Penn agrees to provide Lansdale with all necessary financial reports within 15 (fifteen) days after each billing. North Penn agrees to provide Lansdale, all other necessary information to ensure compliance with audits and other matters.

6. North Penn shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless Lansdale, its employees, agents and assigns from and against any and all causes of actions or claims arising out of or relating to this Agreement, including collection of delinquent fees and water shut off for delinquent accounts.

7. The initial term of the Agreement shall be five (5) years from the date above written, and shall continue in full force and effect thereafter until a party hereto elects to terminate the Agreement by providing the other party ninety (90) days written notice. This Agreement may be terminated for any reason, including during the initial term, by either party, provided such party gives ninety (90) days written notice of such termination. This Agreement may be amended only by a written instrument signed by both parties.

8. Lansdale agrees to share fifty percent (50%) of the initial software implementation costs. In the event North Penn offers sewer billing services to other entities, Lansdale shall be entitled to a pro-rated share of that entity's upfront costs.

9. This Agreement shall be construed in accordance with the Laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

10. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties and there are no other understandings written or oral.

11. If any term or provision of this Agreement, or any part of such term or provision, or the application thereof to any person or circumstance shall to any extent be held invalid or

unenforceable, the remainder of this Agreement or the application of such term or provision or remainder thereof shall not be affected thereby and each term and provision of this Agreement shall be valid and enforceable to the fullest extent permitted by law.

12. This Agreement shall extend to and bind the successors and assigns of the respective parties hereto, as well as the parties hereunder; provided that neither party may assign its rights and obligations under this Agreement without the written consent of the other party.

- IV. The provisions of this Ordinance are declared to be severable. If any provision of this Ordinance is declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional, such determination shall have no effect on the remaining provisions of this Ordinance.
- V. This Ordinance shall become effective five (5) days following its legal enactment.

COST SHARING AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is made this ____ day of _____, 2016, between **NORTH PENN WATER AUTHORITY** (“North Penn”) and **LANSDALE BOROUGH** (“Lansdale”).

RECITALS:

A. North Penn is a Pennsylvania municipal authority with a principal office located at 300 Forty Foot Road, Lansdale, Pennsylvania 19446.

B. Lansdale is a Pennsylvania borough with a principal office located at One Vine Street, Lansdale, PA 19446.

C. Lansdale is proposing certain public roadway improvements in and along Crestview Road between Highland Avenue and Third Street, including sanitary sewer, storm sewer, curbing and sidewalk upgrades (“Lansdale’s Work”).

D. North Penn has existing infrastructure within the area of Lansdale’s Work and desires to upgrade the same in conjunction with Lansdale’s Work.

E. North Penn is proposing the replacement of 545 LF of 6” cast iron main with 545 LF of 8” ductile iron main and the renewal of 4 existing water services (“North Penn’s Work”).

F. Lansdale has agreed to bid and award the entire scope of both Lansdale’s Work and North Penn’s Work. Lansdale’s Work and North Penn’s Work shall collectively be referred to as the “Project”. Each party’s respective scope of responsibility is detailed on Exhibit “A”.

G. Lansdale shall be responsible for constructing and paying for all of the improvements associated with the Project. While North Penn’s Work will be included in the Project bids, North Penn is solely responsible for the costs associated with North Penn’s Work.

H. Lansdale and North Penn desire to set forth in writing their understandings relating to the bidding, construction and payment for the Project.

AGREEMENT

In consideration for the mutual promises contained herein, and intending to be legally bound hereby, the parties hereto agree as follows:

1. Lansdale agrees to advertise for bids for the acquisition of all materials and the performance of all construction and services required to complete the Project.

2. Lansdale agrees that it will bid North Penn's Work as an alternate bid item or bid in such a way that the North Penn's Work will stand on its own. Lansdale will present the bid tabulations and lowest responsible bidder to North Penn for timely review and approval. In the event North Penn does not approve the bid, Lansdale may proceed with Lansdale's Work and North Penn will be responsible for any future bidding of North Penn's Work. North Penn understands, acknowledges and agrees that the ultimate determination of lowest responsible bid lies with Lansdale. In the event North Penn does not approve the lowest responsible bidder, as determined by Lansdale, this Agreement shall terminate and neither party shall thereafter have any further obligation to the other. Nothing in this Agreement shall bind either party to accept a contract bid until the bid is accepted by formal action of such party. In the event that North Penn is in agreement with the lowest responsible bidder, Lansdale and North Penn agree that this Agreement shall remain in full force and effect, and shall control administration of the Project.

3. The parties agree that all official contacts with the contractor determined to be the lowest responsible bidder relating to the Project ("Contractor") shall be made by Lansdale, but North Penn agrees to timely provide all necessary input with regard to water related issues.

4. North Penn agrees to pay Lansdale the total sum required for the completion of North Penn's Work detailed in the Project specifications, payable within thirty (30) days from the dates on which such invoices are submitted by Lansdale to North Penn for water work performed by the Contractor. North Penn's payments shall be made at such times and in such amounts so that Lansdale is not required to "advance" funds on behalf of North Penn.

5. North Penn agrees to advise Lansdale promptly of any change orders which may be required for North Penn's Work and will assume all costs related thereto. North Penn must obtain Lansdale's prior written consent and approval for any change orders that expand the scope of North Penn's Work.

6. Each party shall perform all inspection work related to their Work associated with the Project at their sole cost and expense. Neither party shall be responsible for inspecting any portion of the other's Work. Each party shall be responsible for paying its own inspection costs.

7. The parties agree to provide continuous communication with each other concerning the progress of their respective Work and the parties agree to respond promptly to any requests for information submitted to them by the other party.

8. Upon completion of construction of the Project, Lansdale shall own and be responsible for all costs of maintaining all of the improvements associated with the Project except for North Penn's Work. North Penn shall own and be responsible for the costs of maintaining the improvements associated with North Penn's Work.

9. North Penn agrees to indemnify and hold harmless Lansdale from any and all damages, claims and causes of action relating to the construction of the North Penn's Work and/or inclusion of North Penn's Work into Lansdale's contract for the Project, provided such damage, claim or cause of action was not caused by Lansdale.

10. Lansdale agrees to indemnify and hold harmless North Penn from any and all damages, claims and causes of action relating to the construction of Lansdale's Work, provided such damage, claim or cause of action was not caused by North Penn.

11. The parties agree that any matters not resolved by this Agreement shall immediately be submitted to the executive director of each entity for discussion and resolution. Any matter not resolved between the parties shall be submitted to binding arbitration utilizing the services of the Davenport Dispute Resolution Center of the Montgomery Bar Association.


12. This Agreement shall be construed in accordance with the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and may be modified by a written document executed by the signatories to this Agreement.



ORDINANCE NO. 2016-1885

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF LANSDALE, MONTGOMERY COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF LANSDALE BOROUGH TO ADD THE MADISON STREET PARKING LOT AS A MUNICIPAL PARKING LOT, TO DESCRIBE ITS LOCATION, AND TO DESIGNATE ITS PARKING SPACES ACCORDING TO THE PARKING METER FEE CHARGED; REPEALING ALL INCONSISTENT ORDINANCES OF PARTS THEREOF; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, Lansdale Borough Council has enacted the Code of Ordinance of Lansdale Borough, which contains, inter alia., provisions establishing municipal parking lots in Lansdale Borough, designating their location, and designating the type of parking permitted therein according to the parking meter fee charged for the use of spaces in each municipal parking lot; and

WHEREAS, Council desires to add the Madison Street Parking Lot to the list of municipal parking lots in Lansdale Borough, to describe its location, and to designate its parking spaces according to the parking meter fee charged; and

WHEREAS, Council is authorized to operate municipal parking lots and charge fees for the use thereof pursuant to Section 1202(2) of the Pennsylvania Borough Code, 8 Pa.C.S. §1202(2);

NOW, THEREFORE, be it, and it is hereby **ORDAINED** by the Lansdale Borough Council, and it is hereby **ENACTED** and **ORDAINED** by authority of same as follows:

I. The Lansdale Borough Code of Ordinances is amended to add a new Section 56-10A. as follows:

"56-10A. Madison Street Lot.

- A. Location.** Bordered by Wood Street (both sides of Wood Street north of Madison Street), Madison Street, and the Bethlehem Branch Railroad Line, with vehicular access to Wood Street and Madison Street.
- B. General Designation of Parking Spots.** The Madison Street Lot consists of 157 parking spaces which shall be designated as follows:
 - (1) 12 spaces – 30 minute maximum – Free
 - (2) 121 spaces – 2 hour maximum - \$0.50 per hour
 - (3) 24 spaces – 6 hour maximum - \$0.25 per every 3 hours

II. All ordinances or parts thereof inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of the inconsistency.

III. The provisions of this Ordinance are declared to be severable. If any provision of this Ordinance is declared by a court of competent jurisdiction, such determination shall have no effect on the remaining provisions of this Ordinance or on the provisions of the Code of Ordinance of Lansdale Borough.

IV. This Ordinance shall be effective five (5) days following its legal enactment.

RESOLUTION NO. 2016-07

WHEREAS, The Borough of Lansdale is located in Montgomery County, Pennsylvania (the "Borough"); and

WHEREAS, the Borough constitutes a "governmental unit" as such term is defined under Pennsylvania's Guaranteed Energy Savings Act (62 Pa C.S. §3751 *et seq.*) (the "**Act**"); and

WHEREAS, the Delaware Valley Regional Planning Commission ("**DVRPC**") has established a Regional Streetlight Procurement Program (the "**Program**") to facilitate the implementation of "energy conservation measures" as such term is defined under the Act; and

WHEREAS, the Borough, in its capacity as a governmental unit, has participated in the Program solicitation process and desires to implement the energy conservation measures the Program contemplates; and

WHEREAS, the Borough seeks to appoint a "qualified provider," as such term is defined under the Act, to evaluate, recommend, design, implement, and install the energy conservation measures ("**ECMs**") to be installed or implemented as a result of the Borough's participation in the Program (the "**Project**"); and

WHEREAS, the Borough seeks to enter into a "guaranteed energy savings contract" with a qualified provider for the evaluation, recommendation, and implementation of ECMs for the Project (the "**Guaranteed Savings Agreement**"), substantially in the form attached hereto as Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, Johnson Controls, Inc. ("**JCI**"), a [Wisconsin corporation] serving energy needs in Pennsylvania, desires to be selected as the Borough's qualified provider and desires to enter into the Guaranteed Savings Agreement with the Borough; and

WHEREAS, as part of its proposal to be selected as the Borough's qualified provider, and in accordance with the Act, on [February 2, 2016] JCI presented a report as part of its proposal to become the Borough's qualified provider (the "**Preliminary Audit**"), available for public inspection, summarizing estimates of the costs of installation, maintenance, repairs and debt service and estimates of the amounts by which energy or operating costs will be reduced; and

WHEREAS, under the Act, a governmental unit may enter into a guaranteed energy savings contract with a qualified provider if it finds that the amount it would spend on the energy conservation measures recommended in the qualified provider's proposal would not exceed the amount of energy savings resulting from the energy conservation measures within a period not to exceed 20 years from the date of final installation if the recommendations in the proposal were followed, and the qualified provider provides a written guarantee that the energy savings will meet or exceed the cost of the contract; and

WHEREAS, after reviewing the Preliminary Audit, the Borough has found that the amount it would spend on the energy conservation measures recommended in JCI's Preliminary

Audit will not exceed the amount of energy cost savings resulting from the energy conservation measures within a period not to exceed 20 years from the date of final installation if the recommendations in the Preliminary Audit are followed; and

WHEREAS, JCI desires to perform a comprehensive investment grade energy use and savings analysis, including accompanying schedules (the "**Investment Grade Audit**") for the Borough that will specify the ECMs for the Project; and

WHEREAS, under the terms of the Guaranteed Savings Agreement, JCI will have completed an investment grade audit (the "**Investment Grade Audit**") under which JCI will guarantee to the Borough that, through its participation in the Program, the Borough will achieve energy savings as a result of the Project that will meet or exceed the cost of implementing the energy conservation measures contemplated (the "**Energy Savings**") in an amount equal to or at least 90% of the per unit savings projected in the Preliminary Audit during the period commencing at the installation of the ECMs and running until the bonds issued to finance the Project are paid in full; and

WHEREAS, under the terms of the Guaranteed Savings Agreement, if JCI conducts an Investment Grade Audit that meets the requirements of the preceding paragraph, the Borough will have an obligation to pay JCI the ESCO break fee as outlined in the Guaranteed Savings Agreement incurred in connection with conducting the Investment Grade Audit but the Borough will have no obligation to proceed with the Project at any time prior to the date on which it agrees to the final schedules to the Guaranteed Savings Agreement (the "**Schedules**"), and, in its sole discretion, may determine whether or not to proceed with the Project until such time as it approves such Schedules.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Council of the Borough hereby authorizes the Borough to participate in the Program; and it is

FURTHER RESOLVED that the Council of the Borough hereby appoints JCI as its qualified provider and will make its Preliminary Audit publicly available; and it is

FURTHER RESOLVED that the Council of the Borough hereby authorizes the Borough to enter into the Guaranteed Savings Agreement with JCI, such agreement to be in substantially the same form of the draft attached as Exhibit A hereto, with such changes therein as the Borough's [authorized persons] or designee (an "**Authorized Person**") shall approve, to be conclusively established by the Authorized Person's execution of such agreement; and it is

FURTHER RESOLVED that the Council of the Borough hereby authorizes and directs one or more of its Authorized Person to take all such further actions and to execute and deliver all such instruments and other documents as such Authorized Persons may consider necessary or appropriate to enable the Borough to carry out the intent and purposes of the foregoing resolutions and the transactions contemplated thereby.

WHEREAS, the Borough desires to appoint the Chief Administrative Officer for Borough of Lansdale's Pension Plan.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Borough Council of the Borough of Lansdale hereby adopts the Professional Services Contract Policy for the Lansdale Borough's Pension Plan, attached hereto as "Exhibit A".

FURTHER RESOLVED, That Borough Council of the Borough of Lansdale hereby appoint Brian Shapiro as Chief Administrative Officer for the Borough of Lansdale's Pension Plan, and authorizes such Chief Administrative Officer to administer the Borough of Lansdale's Pension Plan in accordance with the Municipal Pension Plan Funding Standard and Recovery Act.

FURTHER RESOLVED, that if any provision, sentence, clause, section, or part of this Resolution shall for any reason be found to be unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid, such determination shall not affect or impair any of the remaining provisions, sentences, clauses, sections, or parts of this resolution, and it is hereby declared to be the intent of the Borough Council of the Borough of Lansdale that this Resolution would have been adopted had such unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid provision, sentence, clause, section or part not been included herein.

EXHIBIT A

Professional Services Contract Policy Borough of Lansdale's Pension Plan.

The purpose of this policy is to assure compliance with Act 44 of 2009, 53 PS. 895..701-A through 895..707-A, by setting forth policies and procedures applicable to any pension plan or system in which the Borough of Lansdale employees participate.

The Chief Administrative Officer Shall be responsible for distributing and receiving information relating to or arising from this policy in accordance with the following guidelines:

I. DEFINITIONS

AFFILIATED entity- Any of the following:

- (1) A subsidiary or holding company of a lobbying firm or other business entity owned in whole or in part by a lobbying firm.
- (2) An organization recognized by the internal revenue Service as a Tax-exempt organization under section 501(c) of the Internal Revenue Code 1986 (public law 99-514, 26 U.S.C 501 (c) established by a lobbyist or lobbying firm or an affiliated entity.

Borough- refers to Borough of Lansdale, Montgomery County, Pennsylvania, and includes the Board of Supervisors.

Borough Pension System – Any pension plan operated for the benefit of the Borough of Lansdale Employees, including any plan which is administered through the Pennsylvania Municipal Retirement System.

Contributions- any payment, gift, subscription, assessment, contract, payment for services, dues, loan, forbearance, advance, or deposit of money or any valuable thing, to a candidate or political committee made for the purpose of influencing any election in this Commonwealth or for paying debts incurred by or for a candidate or committee before or after any election.

“Contribution” shall also include the purchase of tickets for events such as Dinners, luncheons, rallies and all other fundraising events; the granting of discounts or rebates not available to the general public ; or the granting of discounts or rebates by television and radio stations and new papers not extended on an equal basis to all candidates for the same office; and any payments provided for the benefit of any candidate, including any payments for the services of any person serving as an agent of a candidate or committee by a person other than the candidate or committee or a person whose expenditures the candidate or committee must report under this act the word “contribution” includes any receipt or use of anything of value received by a political committee (section 1621 of the act of June 3,1937(P.L.1333, NO.320), known as the Pennsylvania Election Code.

Executive level employee- An employee of a person or person's affiliated entity who:

- (1) Can affect or influence the outcome of the person's or affiliated entity's actions, policies or decisions relating to pensions and the conduct of business with the Borough or the Borough's pension system; or

- (2) Is directly involved in the implementation or development of policies relating to pensions, investments, contracts or procurement or to the conduct of business with the Borough or Borough's pension system.

Political Committee – As defined in section 1621 of the act of June 3, 1937 (PL 1333, NO 320), Known as the Pennsylvania Election Code (“any committee, club, association or other group of persons which receives contributions or makes expenditures.”)

Professional services contract- A contract to which the Borough pension system is a party that is

- (1) For the purpose or provision of professional services, including investment services, legal services, real estate services and other consulting services; and
- (2) Not subject to a requirement that the lowest bid be accepted.

II. PROCUREMENT FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES CONTRACTS

A. Procedures- the procedures developed by the Borough are intended to ensure selection of the most qualified person to enter into a professional services contract. Advertisement of the availability of a professional services contract will occur in a timely and efficient manner. Applications and disclosure forms are to be used to submit a proposal for review and to receive the award of a professional services contract.

B. Advertisement- An advertisement of the availability of a proposal for a professional services contract shall set forth:

- 1- The services that are the subject of the proposed contract
- 2- Specifications relating to the services,
- 3- Procedures to complete the contracts, and
- 4- Required disclosures

C. Review- Procedures to select the most qualified person shall include the review of the person's qualifications, experience and expertise and the compensation to be charged.

D. Personnel-

- 1- Prior to entering into a professional services contract with the Borough pension system, the contractor shall disclose the names and titles of each individual who will be providing professional services to the Borough pension system, including advisors or subcontractors of the contractor
- 2- Disclosure under this subsection shall include all of the following:
 - (i) Whether the individual is a current or former official or employee of the Borough.
 - (ii) Whether the individual has been a registered Federal or State Lobbyist.
 - (iii) A description of the responsibilities of each individual with regard to the contract.
- 3- The resume of an individual included in the disclosure shall be provided to the Borough upon request.
- 4- The information required under the subsection shall be updated as changes occur.

E. Conflict of interest- The Borough's policy relating to a potential conflicts of interest includes a minimum one-year restriction on:

- 1- Participation by a former employee of a contractor or potential contractor in the review of a proposal or negotiation of a contract with the contractor.
- 2- Participation by a former employee of the municipal pension system in the submission of a proposal of the performance of a contract.

The Borough may determine whether any restriction imposed due to a conflict of interest should extend beyond one year.

F. Public Information- Following the award of a professional services contract, all applications and disclosure forms shall be public for proprietary information or information protected by law.

G. Increase- A professional services contract shall not be amended to increase the cost of the contract by more than 10 % or \$10,000, Whichever is greater, unless the increase and a written justification for the increase are public and posted on the Borough's pension system internet website, if an internet website is maintained, at least (7) days prior to the effective date of the amendment.

H. Notice and Summary- The Relevant Factors that resulted in the award of the professional services contract must be summarized in a written statement to be included in or attached to the documents awarding the contract. Within (10) days of the award of the professional services contract, the original application, a summary of the basis for the award and all required disclosure forms must be transmitted to all unsuccessful applicants. If an internet website is maintained, such documents also must be posted on the municipal pension system's internet website at least (7) days prior to the execution of the professional services contract.

III. AGENTS/SOLICITATION

A. Disclosure- A person or an affiliated entity that intends to enter or enters into a professional services contract shall disclose the employment or compensation of a third party intermediary, agent or lobbyist to directly or indirectly communicate with a Borough pension system official or employee or the Borough official or employee in connection with any transaction or investment involving the contractor and the Borough pension plan. The disclosure shall not apply to an officer or employee of the investment firm who is acting within the scope of the firm's standard professional duties on behalf of the firm, including the actual provision of legal, accounting, engineering, real estate or other professional advice, services or assistance pursuant to a professional services contract with the Borough pension plan.

B. Solicitation- A person that enters into or has applied for, submitted an offer or bid for, responded to a request for a proposal on or otherwise solicited a professional services contract with a Borough pension system or an agent, officer, director or employee of that person may not solicit a contribution to a Borough official or candidate for Borough office or to the political party or political action committee to the official or candidate.

C. Limitation on Communication- Upon the advertisement for the professional services contract by the Borough pension system, the contractor may not cause or agree to allow a third party to communicate with officials or employees of the Borough pension system except for request for technical clarification. Requests for technical clarification shall be made by a designated employee of the Borough pension system. Nothing in this subsection shall preclude a potential contractor from responding to requests for clarification or additional information from the Borough pension system.

IV. DISQUALIFICATION

A. Contributions – A person of an affiliated entity that, within the past (2) years, has made a contribution a Borough official or a candidate for Borough office may not enter into a professional services contract with the Borough pension system, except that the two-year restriction shall not apply to any contribution made prior to the effective date of this subsection.

B. Relationships- A person or an affiliated entity that enters into a professional services contract with The Borough pension system may not have a direct financial, commercial or business relationship with any official of the Borough pension system or the Borough unless the Borough pension system consents in writing to the relationship following full disclosure.

C. Gifts- A person with a professional services contract may not offer or confer a gift having more than a nominal value, including money, services, loans, travel, lodging, entertainment, discount or other thing of value, to any official, employee or fiduciary of the Borough pension system.

V. DISCLOSURES

A. Contractors-

(1) A person or an affiliated entity that has a professional services contract with the Borough pension system shall disclose all contributions to which all of the following apply:

- (i) The contribution was made within the last five years.
- (ii) The contribution was made by an officer, director, executive –level employee or owner of at least 5% of the pension or affiliated entity
- (iii) The amount of the contribution was at least \$ 500 in the form of:
 - A- A single contribution by a person included in subparagraph(ii), Or
 - B- The aggregate of contributions by all persons listed in subparagraph (ii)
- (iv) The contribution was made to:
 - (A) A candidate for any public office in the Commonwealth or to an individual who holds that office, or
 - (B) A political committee of a candidate for the public office in the Commonwealth or of an individual who holds that office

(2) The information provided under this subsection shall be updated annually

B. Additional disclosure- A person or an affiliated entity that has a professional services contract with the Borough pension system shall disclose all of the following:

- 1) Information relating to individuals making contributions, including:
 - (i) The name and address of the contribution.
 - (ii) The contributor's relationship to the contractor.
 - (iii) The name and office or position of each person receiving a contribution.
 - (iv) The amount of the contribution.
 - (v) The date of the contribution.
- 2) Gifts to an official or employee of the Borough pension system or the Borough
- 3) The employment or retention of any third- party intermediary, agent or lobbyist and the duties of that person.
- 4) The existence of any financial relationship under section IV (B) above.

C. Applicability- The provisions of section IV(A) above shall apply to a person and an affiliated entity that has applied for, submitted an offer or bid for, responded to a request for proposal or otherwise solicited a professional services contract with the Borough pension system.

D. Forms- Required disclosure shall be made on a form prepared by the Borough pension system. The form will be attached to the contract and posted on the system's internet website during the term of the contract; an updated form shall be filed annually in accordance with procedures adopted by the plan.

E. Penalties- The following shall apply:

1) The Borough's pension system shall void the professional services contract of a person that knowingly makes a material misstatement or omission in a disclosure form under this chapter and shall prohibit the person from entering into a contract for a period of up to (3) years.

2) If a contractor or person that has submitted a proposal or bid in a violation of paragraph (1) more than two times in a 36- month period, all contracts between that contractor and the Borough pension system shall be void and that person shall be debarred for a period of at least (3) years from the date of last violation.

VI. DUTY TO ACT

If a person that enters into or has applied for, submitted an offer or bid for, responded to a request for proposal on or otherwise solicited a contract with the Borough system or an officer, Director or employee of the Borough pension system is aware and reasonably should be aware of an apparent, potential or actual conflict of interest; the person shall disclose the conflict and promptly eliminate the conflict.

VII. NO PREEMPTION OF STRICTER RULES OR LAWS

This Policy shall not be construed to preempt or limit the application of any provision, regulation or law imposing a stricter code of ethics.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF LANSDALE, MONTGOMERY COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, AMENDING CHAPTER 114-5 OF THE LANSDALE BOROUGH CODE TO ADD AN ADDITIONAL LOCATION FOR HANDICAPPED PARKING; REPEALING ALL INCONSISTENT ORDINANCES; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND CONTAINING AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, the Pennsylvania Borough Code authorizes the Borough to enact ordinances in the best interest of the public health, safety, and welfare; and

WHEREAS, Lansdale Borough Council has determined that it is in the best interest of the residents to provide for handicapped parking as provided herein.

The Lansdale Borough Code is amended to add the following location for handicapped parking to Chapter 114-5 (D)(2):

“174 East Second Street; 95 feet to 115 feet in a westerly direction along the South curblineline measured from the west curblineline with North Line Street.”

SECTION II. SEVERABILITY

In the event that any section, sentence, clause, or word of this Ordinance shall be declared illegal, invalid or unconstitutional by any Court of competent jurisdiction, such declaration shall not prevent, preclude or otherwise foreclose the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

WHEREAS, Lansdale Borough Council has enacted the Code of Ordinances of Lansdale Borough, which contains, inter alia, provisions prohibiting parking of vehicles at all times on specific streets in Lansdale Borough; and

WHEREAS, the Borough has determined that the sight distance exiting onto E. 4th Street from both Williamson Court and the parallel alley is often blocked by vehicles parked on the north side of East 4th Street at those locations, which presents a hazard to the safety to the residents of the Borough and the traveling and pedestrian public; and

WHEREAS, Borough Council is authorized by the Pennsylvania Vehicle Code to prohibit parking of vehicles at all times at certain locations within Lansdale Borough, and has determined that such a prohibition is required at the location stated above in order to protect the health, safety and welfare of the residents of Lansdale Borough and the traveling and pedestrian public;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it, and it is hereby **ORDAINED** by the Lansdale Borough Council, and it is hereby **ENACTED** and **ORDAINED** by authority of same as follows:

I. The Code of Ordinance of Lansdale Borough is amended to add the following location to the existing list of locations at which parking is prohibited at all times:

II. The appropriate no-parking signs are hereby authorized to be erected to provide notice of the provisions of this Ordinance.

III. The Lansdale Police Department is authorized to enforce the provisions of this Ordinance.

IV. All ordinances or parts thereof inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of the inconsistency.

V. The provisions of this Ordinance are declared to be severable. If any provision of this Ordinance is declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional, such determination shall have no effect on the remaining provisions of this Ordinance or on the provisions of the Code of Ordinance of Lansdale Borough.

VI. This Ordinance shall take effect five (5) days following its legal enactment.

ORDINANCE NO. 2016-1888

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF LANSDALE, MONTGOMERY COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, TO AMEND SECTIONS 7-4 AND 7-5 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF LANSDALE BOROUGH IN THEIR ENTIRETIES TO RESTATE THE PROVISIONS FOR “APPLICATIONS AND QUALIFICATIONS” AND “EXAMINATION AND GRADING PROCEDURE” FOR THE LANSDALE BOROUGH CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION, AND TO AMEND SECTION 7-6 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF LANSDALE BOROUGH TO CROSS-REFERENCE THE PERFORMANCE REQUIREMENTS FOR THE RANK OF LIEUTENANT; REPEALING ALL INCONSISTENT ORDINANCE OR PARTS THEREOF; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, Lansdale Borough Council has enacted the Code of Ordinances of Lansdale Borough which contains, *inter alia*, provisions governing the Lansdale Borough Civil Service Commission, and specifically provisions governing “Applications and Qualifications”, “Examination and Grading Procedure” and “Certification of the List of Eligibles and Appointment”; and

WHEREAS, Borough Council desires to amend the above-referenced provisions of the Civil Service Commission regulations to include general qualifications for applicants for the rank of lieutenant, to add examination requirements for the rank of lieutenant, to remove the requirement for a physical agility test for the rank of sergeant, and to add a cross-reference to the requirement of fulfilling the performance requirement for the rank of lieutenant; and

WHEREAS, the proposed amendments to the Civil Service Commission regulations are declared to be in the best interests of the health, safety and welfare of the residents of Lansdale Borough;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it, and it is hereby **ORDAINED** by Lansdale Borough Council, and it is hereby **ENACTED** and **ORDAINED** by authority of same as follows:

I. Section 7-4 of the Code of Ordinances of Lansdale Borough is amended in its entirety to read as follows:

§7-4. Applications and qualifications.

A. Eligibility for examination.

(1) In order to be included for participation in any examination for any position with the Police Department, every applicant must submit a completed application to the Commission before the deadline stated by the Commission before the deadline stated by the Commission for that specific examination.

(2) The statements made by the applicant in the application shall contain no falsification, omission or concealment of material fact. The applicant must make an oath to the penalties of 18 Pa.C.S.A. §4904. Should investigation disclose any willful misstatement, falsification, omission or concealment with respect to any item contained in an application,

- a. The application shall be invalid and the applicant shall be disqualified from examination;
- b. If the applicant shall have been examined, the name of such applicant shall be removed from the eligible list; or
- c. If the applicant shall have been appointed, such willful misstatement, falsification, omission or concealment shall constitute grounds for dismissal from the Police Department.

B. Discrimination. The Borough of Lansdale is an equal opportunity employer. It is the policy of the Borough of Lansdale and the Commission to grant equal employment opportunities to qualified persons without regard to race, religion, color, national origin, gender, age, veteran's status, marital status, sexual orientation, or non-job related physical or mental handicaps or disabilities. The Borough of Lansdale and the Commission will provide equal opportunities in employment and promotion.

C. Availability of application. Application forms shall be available to all interested persons in the office of the Borough Secretary and from such other offices and officers that the Commission, from time to time, may choose to designate. Application forms may be mailed upon written or telephone request. However, the Commission assumes no responsibility for missed filing deadlines due to delay in the mail.

D. Age and residency requirements. Each applicant must have reached his 21st birthday before the deadline for submitting completed applications. An applicant must agree in writing to establish his permanent residence within a ten-mile radius of the Borough Hall within six months after completing his probationary period.

E. General qualifications for all applicants. Each applicant for any position in the Police Department shall:

(1) Be a citizen of the United States of America. In the case of a naturalized citizen, evidence of naturalization satisfactory to the Commission shall be provided by the applicant.

(2) Have completed a course of study at a police academy certified by the MPOETC and be able to meet the standards of the MPOETC as required by Act 120 or qualify for a waiver of training under the standards of the MPOETC. In the event that an applicant receives a partial waiver of MPOETC requirements, applicant will complete necessary courses to receive full MPOETC accreditation prior to employment.

(3) Meet one of the following education and/or experience requirements:

a. Have completed a minimum of two years (60 semester hours) from an accredited college (any credits awarded from MPOETC are applicable); or

b. Have completed two years' active duty military experience with an honorable discharge and/or eligibility for honorable discharge if still engaged in military service at the time of application; or

c. Have two years' experience as a certified law enforcement officer with a minimum of 1,000 hours of actual on-the-job experience.

(4) Possess a valid motor vehicle operator's license valid in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, which license shall not be suspended or revoked at the time of filing this application.

(5) Be of good moral character and be physically and mentally fit to perform the full duties of a police officer.

(6) Not have been convicted of any local, state or federal offense that is classified as a misdemeanor or felony.

(7) Be able to perform and meet the essential job functions and personal characteristics requirements as adopted by the Commission in §7-10 hereof.

F. General qualifications for applicant for Sergeant.

(1) (Reserved)

(2) Each applicant for the position of Sergeant shall:

a. Have at least two years of experience in the Lansdale Borough Police Department;

b. Have satisfactorily completed a basic training program for police officers and be currently certified by the MPOETC;

c. Have demonstrated an ability to carry out orders from supervisors;

d. Demonstrate a working knowledge of police science and administration as ascertained by an appropriate promotional examination;

e. Demonstrate an ability to deliver and supervise the work of subordinates;

f. Have received an overall evaluation of average or above and shall not have received an unacceptable rating in any category on the last performance evaluation.

g. Not have been suspended from duty for more than two (2) total days in the two (2) years prior to the date on which an application for Sergeant is made available.

G. General qualifications for applicant for Lieutenant.

(1) Each applicant for the position of Lieutenant shall:

a. Have a minimum of four (4) years of experience in the Lansdale Borough Police Department, a minimum of two (2) of such years must have been in the rank of police Sergeant;

- b. Have satisfactorily completed a basic training program for police officers and be currently certified by the MPOETC;
- c. Have demonstrated an ability to carry out orders from supervisors;
- d. Demonstrate a working knowledge of police science and administration as ascertained by an appropriate promotional examination;
- e. Have knowledge of department policies, rules, regulations and administrative practices;
- f. Demonstrate an ability to deliver and supervise the work of subordinates;
- g. Have received an overall evaluation of average or above and shall not have received an unacceptable rating in any category on the last performance evaluation; and
- h. Must have strong leadership, management, organizational and communication skills, be self-motivated and able to build a team environment.
- i. Not have been suspended from duty for more than three (3) total days in the five (5) years prior to the date on which an application for Lieutenant is made available.

H. Disqualification of applicant. The Commission may refuse to examine or, if examined, may refuse to designate as eligible after examination any applicant who is found to lack any of the minimum qualifications for examination prescribed in these rules and regulations for the particular position for which the applicant has applied. In addition, the Commission may refuse to examine or, if examined, may refuse to designate as eligible any applicant who is physically or mentally unfit to perform the full duties of the position to which he or she seeks employment or who is a habitual substance abuser, who is guilty of any crime involving moral turpitude or of infamous or notoriously disgraceful conduct, or who has been dismissed from public service for delinquency or misconduct in office, or who is affiliated with any group whose policies or activities are subversive to the form of government set forth in the Constitution of the United States and of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

I. Recording and filing applications. Applications for positions in the Police Department shall be available pursuant to §7-4.C hereof only after an examination has been properly advertised and before the deadline for receiving applications which shall be set forth in the public advertisement. Applications will be received by the person designated in the public advertisement or his designee. That person shall record the receipt of all applications and provide each applicant with notice of the time and place for the first portion of the testing procedure, the written examination. Any application containing material errors or omissions may, at the discretion of the Commission, be returned to the applicant for correction prior to the deadline for filing applications, after which no new applications or amended applications will be accepted. An application shall become invalid one year after the date upon which it was received.

II. Section 7-5 of the Code of Ordinances of Lansdale Borough is amended in its entirety to read as follows:

§7-5. Examination and grading procedure.

A. Public notice. Public notice of the time and place of the examination, together with information as to the position to be filled, shall be given by publication in the newspaper of general circulation in the Borough of Lansdale. The public notice shall be published at least two (2) weeks prior to an examination, and a copy of the notice shall be posted on the bulletin board in the Borough Hall. Additional public notice by publication, posting or otherwise, may be given at any time at the direction of the Commission.

B. Notice of examination.

(1) In addition to the public announcement of the written examination, the Secretary shall give timely written notice as follows:

a. By mailing or otherwise delivering to each applicant who shall have passed the written examination and who is scheduled by the Commission for oral and polygraph examination notice which shall include the date, time, place and duration of the oral examination and polygraph examination.

b. Every such notice shall be mailed or otherwise delivered at least seven (7) days prior to the date fixed for that portion of this examination. Only an applicant receiving notice to report shall be permitted to participate, and each applicant shall present his notice to the examiner before he or she shall be examined. Failure to report for any portion of the examination in accordance with the instructions contained in the written notice shall disqualify the applicant, and the conditional offer of employment (if applicable) shall be immediately withdrawn except that, in the case of a medical or psychological examination, the applicant, with the prior approval of the medical examiner and/or psychologist designated in the notice, may fix another date and time for such examination; provided, however, that any such date or time shall be within a period of five (5) days from the date established in the written notice.

C. Appointment of examiners. The Commission may, from time to time, appoint one or more qualified examiners to supervise or conduct all portions of the examinations required by these rules and regulations.

D. Conditional offer of employment. Every applicant receiving a conditional offer of employment and accepting same shall be required to submit to a medical examination and a psychological examination and shall meet the minimum requirements specified by the MPOETC and the Commission.

E. Report of examiner. The Commission may furnish each examiner with forms upon which the examiner shall state the physical and/or mental condition of each applicant. The report of each examination shall be submitted to the Commission within five (5) days after the date of the examination.

F. Rejection of unfit applicants. If the examiner shall deem any applicant unfit for performance of duties of a police officer because of any physical or mental defect, whether or not the defect shall be specifically stated as cause for rejection in the statement of medical requirements, or because of any requirement of Act 120 established and regulated by the MPOETC or if any applicant fails to meet the provisions of the conditional offer of employment, the conditional offer of employment shall be withdrawn and such applicant shall be rejected and a brief statement of the reasons for rejection shall be entered in the file of the applicant.

G. Reexamination of fitness. Each applicant, to be eligible for appointment to any position in the Police Department, shall be deemed fit as determined by the testing procedures set forth in Subsection H hereof and by current Act 120 certification. If, in the judgment of the Commission, there shall have been any change in the fitness of any applicant, whether or not such changes shall have been reported by the applicant, the Commission may require the applicant to submit to a further testing before being certified for appointment.

I. Percentage of value of examination elements. Each of the written examinations and oral examinations shall be graded on a scale of 100% and shall be weighted as indicated in subsection H.

J. Passing grades. The minimum passing grade for an examination for the position of Sergeant, Lieutenant, and Chief of Police shall be a score of 70%, and each applicant for any such position shall score at least 70% on each element (excluding pass/fail elements) of the examination. The minimum passing grade for an examination for the position of police officer shall be a score of 75%, and each applicant for such position shall score at least 75% on each element (excluding pass/fail elements) of the examination. Every applicant for the position of police officer who receives a score of at least 75% on the examination and who is entitled by law to additional credit for service in the Armed Forces of the United States shall have his or her total score adjusted by the addition of 10 points. An applicant claiming veterans' preference shall submit additional satisfactory proof of active service and honorable discharge whenever the Commission shall so demand.

K. Notice of applicant's grade. When the grading of each portion of any examination is completed, the Secretary shall give each applicant written notice of his grade.

L. Ineligibility for future examination for six months. If an applicant fails to obtain a passing grade in any examination, he or she shall not be permitted to participate in a subsequent examination for a position, excluding promotional positions, in the Police Department of the Borough of Lansdale for six (6) months.

M. Administering examinations. The Commission may designate any recognized examining agency to act as examiner for any examination portion thereof. The Commission shall reserve the right to accept or reject for cause, in whole or in part, the recommendation of the appointed examining agency.

N. Conduct of written examinations. The Commission shall prepare a statement of instructions and rules for the conduct of written examinations. The appointed examiner shall administer each examination in accordance with the instructions of the Commission and shall be responsible for enforcing the rules of conduct for written examinations.

O. Background investigation of applicant.

¹ Optional

(1) The Commission shall request the Chief of Police, or his designee, to conduct a background investigation on each applicant. The background investigation shall include but not be limited to the completion of a background questionnaire, interviews with the applicant's family, acquaintances, current and former employers, current and former neighbors, references and current and former teachers and school officials. In addition, the applicant's credit history and record of criminal convictions shall be investigated. The information obtained during the background investigation may be verified during the polygraph portion of the examination.

(2) The applicant may be interviewed directly when the information collected during the background investigation requires clarification or explanation. After the background investigation is complete, the Chief or his designee shall make a written recommendation to the Commission on whether the applicant is appropriate for consideration for appointment as a police officer. Appropriateness of the applicant shall be based on the criteria set forth in §7-4 of these rules and regulations. This recommendation shall be in writing, and if the recommendation is to disqualify, then a detailed written explanation of the reasons for disqualification must be included. The Commission shall make the final determination on whether the information collected during the background investigation warrants rejection of the candidate.

P. Penalty for improper conduct. Should an applicant intentionally commit any act tending to defeat the proper conduct or the result of any examination, his or her name shall be removed from the eligible list resulting from the examination and the applicant shall not be permitted to make future application for any position in the Police Department.

Q. Number of applicants to be tested. Notwithstanding any contrary provision of these rules and regulations, the Commission may, at its election, limit the number of applicants for police officer who shall be permitted to participate at the oral examination and subsequent stages, regardless of the total number of applicants passing the written examination.

III. Section 7-6.A. of the Code of Ordinances of Lansdale Borough is amended to read as follows:

A. Creation of eligible list. At the completion of the written examination, oral examination, background investigation and polygraph examination, the Commission shall rank all passing applicants on a list with the applicant receiving the highest score at the top of the list and the applicant receiving the lowest passing score at the bottom of the list. Applicants who qualify for veterans' preference points shall have those points added to their passing score prior to being ranked on the eligible list. For Sergeant positions, fulfilling the performance requirements set forth in §7-4.F is also required, and for Lieutenant positions, fulfilling the performance requirements set forth in §7-4.G is also required. In the case of tied scores, the tie will be broken by giving preference to the applicant who submitted a final completed application first. If both the tied applicants submitted their completed applications on the same day, then the applicants shall be ranked in alphabetical order by surname. The eligibility list shall be valid for one (1) year from the date the Commission ranks all passing applicants, assigns veterans' preference points and formally adopts the eligibility list. The Commission may, at its sole discretion, by a vote of the majority of the Commission at a duly authorized Commission meeting, extend the list for an additional one (1) year. The Commission may, at its sole discretion, void an eligibility list at any time for any reason.

IV. All ordinances or parts thereof inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of the inconsistency.

V. The provisions of this Ordinance are declared to be severable. If any provision of this Ordinance is declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional, such determination shall have no effect on the remaining provisions of this Ordinance or on the provisions of the Code of Ordinances of Lansdale Borough.

VI. This Ordinance shall become effective five (5) days following its legal enactment.

CONSENT ASSESSMENT OF CIVIL PENALTY

This Consent Assessment of Civil Penalty (“CACP”) is entered into this ___ day of _____ 2016, by and between the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, Department of Environmental Protection (“Department”), and Lansdale Borough (“Lansdale”).

The Department has found and determined the following:

A. The Department is the agency with the authority to administer and enforce the Clean Streams Law, the Act of June 22, 1937, P.L. 1987, as amended, 35 P.S. §§ 691.1 et seq. (“Clean Streams Law”), and the Rules and Regulations promulgated thereunder.

B. Lansdale is a Pennsylvania “municipality,” as that term is defined in Section 1 of the Clean Streams Law, 35 P.S. § 691.1, with business offices at One Vine Street, Lansdale, PA 19446.

C. Lansdale owns and operates the sanitary sewage collection system within Lansdale Borough.

D. On January 4, 2015, Lansdale discharged approximately 3,000 gallons of sewage from manhole B-100A which flowed into the stormwater inlet on Wedgewood Drive which drains to an unnamed tributary to the West Branch of the Neshaminy Creek, a water of the Commonwealth. This discharge is a dry weather Sanitary Sewer Overflow (“SSO”).

E. On January 5, 2015, the Department conducted a complaint investigation, confirming and documenting the SSO, referenced in Paragraph D above.

F. On January 29, 2015, the Department issued a NOV to Lansdale Borough for the SSO.

G. On February 25, 2015, Lansdale Borough responded to the NOV indicating the measures that will be taken to prevent future occurrences of SSO’s as requested.

H. On May 15, 2015, the Department conducted an Administrative review of the eDMR and EFACTS open violation data and found four violations that occurred between March 31, 2013, and January 5, 2015. The effluent violations were for Exceeding the Instantaneous Maximum Concentration for Fecal Coliform bacteria in the effluent, and the fourth is directly related to the SSO.

I. Sections 201 and 202 of the Clean Streams Law, 35 P.S. §§ 691.201 and 691.202, prohibit the discharge of sewage into Waters of the Commonwealth, except as provided under the Clean Streams Law and the Rules and Regulations of the Department.

J. The discharge of sewage into Waters of the Commonwealth by Lansdale, as described in Paragraphs E, herein was not authorized by NPDES Permit, or by regulation, and thereby constitutes a violation of §§ 201 and 202 of the Clean Streams Law, 35 P.S. §§ 691.201 and 691.202.

K. Section 401 of the Clean Streams Law, 35 P.S. § 691.401, prohibits the discharge of any polluting substance into waters of the Commonwealth resulting in pollution.

L. The discharge of sewage into Waters of the Commonwealth by Lansdale, as described in Paragraphs E herein, was not authorized by NPDES Permit, or by regulation, and thereby constitutes a violation of § 401 of the Clean Streams Law, 35 P.S. § 691.401.

M. Section 91.34(a) of the Department's Rules and Regulations, 25 Pa. Code § 91.34(a), states: "Persons engaged in an activity which includes the impoundment, production, processing, transportation, storage, use, application or disposal of pollutants shall take necessary measures to prevent the substances from directly or indirectly reaching waters of this Commonwealth, through accident, carelessness, maliciousness, hazards of weather or from another cause."

N. Lansdale's failure to take appropriate measures to prevent the release of a polluting substance from being released to Waters of the Commonwealth is a violation of 25 Pa. Code § 91.34(a).

O. The violations described in the preceding paragraphs constitute unlawful conduct under Section 611 of the Clean Streams Law, 35 P.S. § 691.611, and subject Lansdale to a claim for civil penalties under Section 605 of the Clean Streams Law, 35 P.S. § 691.605.

After full and complete negotiation of all matters set forth in this CACP and upon mutual exchange of the covenants herein, the parties desiring to avoid litigation and intending to be legally bound, it is hereby **ASSESSED** by the Department and **AGREED** to by Lansdale as follows:

1. **Assessment.** In resolution of the Department's claim for civil penalties, which the Department is authorized to pursue under Section 605 of the Clean Streams Law, 35 P.S. § 691.605, the Department hereby assesses a civil penalty of **THREE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED FORTY TWO DOLLARS (\$3,842)**, which Lansdale hereby agrees to pay.

2. **Civil Penalty Settlement.** Upon signing this CACP, Lansdale shall pay the civil penalty assessed in Paragraph 1. The payment is in settlement of the Department's claim for civil penalties for the violations set forth in Paragraphs D, H, J, L and N, above, for the dates set forth in Paragraphs D through H, above. The payment of **\$3,842** shall be by corporate check or the like, made payable to "The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, Clean Water Fund" and shall be sent to: Mr. Steve Flannery, Compliance Specialist, PA Department of Environmental Protection, Southeast Regional Office, 2 East Main Street, Norristown, PA 19401.

3. **Findings.**

(a) Lansdale agrees that the findings in Paragraphs A through O are true and correct and, in any matter or proceeding involving Lansdale and the Department, Lansdale shall not challenge the accuracy or validity of these findings.

(b) The parties do not authorize any other persons to use the findings in this CACP in any matter or proceeding.

4. **Reservation of Rights.** The Department reserves all other rights with respect to any matter addressed by this CACP, including the right to require abatement of any conditions resulting from the events described in the Findings. Lansdale reserves the right to challenge any action which the Department may take, but waives the right to challenge the content or validity of this CACP.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties have caused this CACP to be executed by their duly authorized representatives. The undersigned representatives of Lansdale certify, under penalty of law, as provided by 18 Pa.C.S. § 4904, that they are authorized to execute this CACP on behalf of Lansdale; that Lansdale consents to the entry of this CACP as an **ASSESSMENT** of the Department; that Lansdale hereby knowingly waives any right to a hearing under the statutes referenced in this CACP and that Lansdale knowingly waives its right to appeal this CACP, which rights may be available under Section 4 of the Environmental Hearing Board Act, the Act of July 13, 1988, P.L. 530, No. 1988-94, 35 P.S. § 7514; the Administrative Agency Law, 2 Pa.C.S. § 103(a) and Chapters 5A and 7A; or any other provision of law.
