Dear Congressman Boyle:

On behalf of the Borough of Lansdale, in partnership with American Municipal Power, Inc. (AMP), we want to thank you for your continuous support of the Borough of Lansdale and are jointly encouraging members of the U.S. House of Representatives to join the bipartisan Municipal Finance Caucus recently announced by Reps. Randy Hultgren (R-Illinois) and Dutch Ruppersberger (D-Maryland). The purpose of the Municipal Finance Caucus is to facilitate the discussion about opportunities and challenges states and local governments must embrace to independently finance a wide range of initiatives, and to advocate for bipartisan policies that enhance their access to the capital markets.

Municipal bonds are of vital importance for state and local governments in developing infrastructure projects that will strengthen their communities. Of all the infrastructure investments made in the United States, three-fourths are financed through municipal bonds. The municipal bond market is estimated to be \$3.7 trillion and are widely considered to be safe investments.

The projects financed by municipal bonds impact the daily lives of American citizens and businesses. These are the schools, streets and highways, bridges, public housing, sewer, water systems, courthouses, hospitals and clinics, airports and ports, and energy infrastructure that powers our homes, businesses and factories.

In March, more than 600 state and local governments sent a letter to the leadership of the House Ways and Means Committee expressing the importance of the tax-exempt status of this type of debt. The letter includes signatures from officials in nearly every state and the District of Columbia.

We encourage you to join them in this cause. The Caucus plans to hold a number of events in the future based on the membership's interest and timely issues. Briefings may feature local bond issuers, the broker-dealers that facilitate this valuable market, and the perspective of the regulators that oversee it.

RESOLUTION NO. 2016-21

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOROUGH OF LANSDALE, MONTGOMERY COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, APPROVING THE SALE, BY ELECTRONIC AUCTION, OF VARIOUS ITEMS OF BOROUGH PERSONAL PROPERTY; REPEALING ALL INCONSISTENT RESOLUTIONS OR PARTS THEREOF; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, Borough desires to sell various items of personal property that are no longer of use to the Borough, and

WHEREAS, the Borough desires to sell the property on Municibid, a recognized electronic auction site for municipal personal property; and

WHEREAS, the Borough is authorized to sell personal property via electronic auction sale pursuant to Section 1201.2(a.1) of the Pennsylvania Borough Code; and

WHEREAS, Council is required by Section 1201.2(a) of the Pennsylvania Borough Code to approve any sale of Borough personal property by resolution; and

WHEREAS, Council desires to approve the sale of various items of personal property via Municibid in accordance with the requirements of the Borough Code;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it, and it is hereby **RESOLVED** by the Lansdale Borough Council, and it is hereby **ADOPTED** and **RESOLVED** by authority of same as follows:

- I. The sale of the items set forth on the spreadsheet attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein by reference by electronic auction sale using Municibid is hereby approved.
- II. The appropriate Borough employees and consultants are hereby authorized to take all steps required to sell the property by electronic auction sale using Municibid.
- III. All resolutions or parts thereof inconsistent with the provisions of this Resolution are hereby repealed to the extent of the inconsistency.
- IV. The provisions of this Resolution are declared to be severable. If any provision of this Resolution is declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional, such determination shall have no effect on the remaining provisions of this Resolution.
- V. This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon its legal adoption.


