### **Electric Committee Work Session Minutes**

The First action item of the evening was to approve the March 2023 minutes. The committee voted unanimously to approve the minutes. **\*3-0**

The Borough's environmental action committee gave a brief presentation on the ready for 100 model ordinance that they would like to see the Borough adopt. The committee reviewed the ordinance and gave feedback on possible changes to aggressive timelines and aggressive generation numbers. The borough has been working hard the last 5 to 6 years to implement plans for lowering our carbon footprint and generating our own renewable energy on site. We will continue to pursue these options.

Mr. Green then presented an update for electric vehicle level 2 chargers and funding options for possible monetary collection and sponsorships. **We will have more to come on this in May.**

The committee then reviewed possibilities for Willow Street Park solar facilities. Mr. Green presented 3 options. Option one would be to have Lucent energy do a current cost estimate and return on investment plus max output for \$4,750. Option 2 would be for Bluesky to do the same work minus the 3-D modeling for \$5500. The 3rd option was to look at alternate locations like the wastewater treatment plant to install more renewable energy since the plant is more conducive Both esthetically and the industrial electrical equipment is ready for electrical Load capacity increase. The committee would like to put the Willow Street project on hold and look for options at WWTP along with the pump station at Willow Street and leave the park as a park.

Mr. Green then reviewed the electric bill layout with the committee. Along with comments from the finance director Glenn Dickerson. The Borough will be moving towards a more user-friendly electric bill layout.

Mr. Green then reviewed department operations for the month of March 2023 with the committee.

The committee then reviewed the year-to-date 2023 Electric operational budget. The biggest variance is for engineering and most of those costs will be coded to capital before year end.

The meeting adjourned 8:25 PM.
